

Interest Building for Canadian Premiere Evening in Provost

• Former Rosenheim Man to be Honoured at Gala Event

Tickets are now being sold for "Pete: Moving Manmade Mountains" which is an hour and a half docu-drama film made by Vancouver writer and producer Bill Stewart.

Stewart told *The Provost News* from his Vancouver office just after returning from Detroit last week that some people from afar indicating they will attend the Provost event include head of technical communications writer Mike DeAndreas from Knoxville, Tennessee (for E. W. Scripps that provides content to a variety of U.S. media). His son, an apparent well known drummer also wants to come; John Poole of Corinth Films (who owns the rights to 64 episodes and several dozen Hopalong Cassidy movies from Pennsylvania); and a lawyer and international film businessman, Holger Wrede of New York say they will take in the evening.

Representatives of a Christian web network are considering attending as well adds Stewart. Jerry Matyiko of Expert House Movers from Sharptown, Maryland is "hoping to come" to the Provost event he said in a telephone interview with *The News* on Sunday, March 25. That company, says Stewart provided "all the muscle for all the building moves that Pete directed."

The U.S. premiere of the film took place March 19 and 20 in Detroit, showing how former Provost area resident Pete Friesen struggled from adversity to go on to achieve greatness by sheer work and deter-
