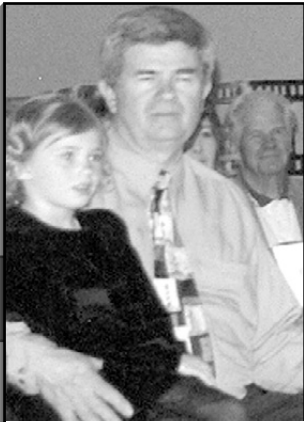

Many people from this corner of North America got to see and hear a wise 85 year old man named Pete Friesen on Saturday night when an evening was set aside to honour him here.

On Friday morning when Pete talked to approximately 120 school students he held their attention, explaining to them what he experienced at their age and the lessons he learned while living nearby on the farm, and while attending a one room school. He probably left a lasting impression with them as he went through a slide show specifically made for pupils.

The famous man was featured in a film that included his time here as a child and how he learned lessons from this part of the Prairies.

A truly inspirational story with a “can-do attitude” was brought by the honoured guest. Of course many in our community hold similar sentiments and they should be encouraged, for that is what it takes for progress here to continue.

Pete demonstrates to young and old through hard work and perseverance that excellence can be achieved, like his Guinness World Records, and being part of the outstanding team that was presented with the Opal Award in the United States—while also overcoming personal problems.

Yet his quiet humility shines through . . . for when he was interviewed over the telephone for this newspaper just over a year ago, he was asked if his world records still stood. He said that he didn't know, and that it wasn't really important. What was likely important to him is that he simply and efficiently got the job done, whether others believed in him or not.

But sometimes as Canadians we are too shy about our achievements—we should stop more often and recognize people like him.

We have many home-grown achievers right in this community, including talented musicians, students, staff, artists, world class ranchers and farmers, health care workers, businessmen, skilled energy workers, teachers, volunteers, thinkers and planners and maybe most important—dreamers.

As Julie Blue wrote and composed in a very brief moment of inspiration that is featured in the film, *Pete, Moving Manmade Mountains*: “Believe in yourself.”

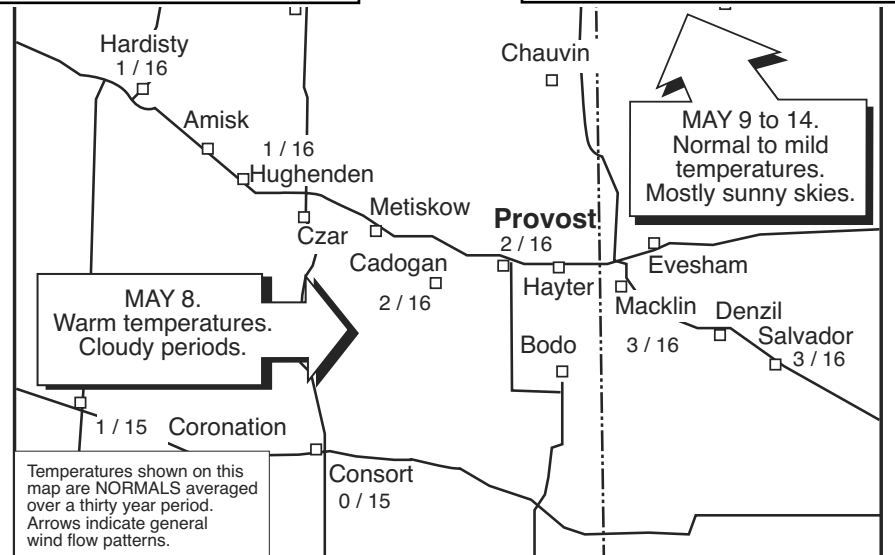
