Highest Interest: Water-related Facility

A new water-related facility like a swimming pool or water park received the highest interest from those who returned questionnaires in a survey that gleaned answers from the public about a proposed multi-use recreation facility in Provost.

No numbers are immediately available but second most popular was an ice arena while third choice was for playgrounds and walking trails. Fourth was for some type of physical and wellness fitness centre like a workout or gym facility.

Eighty-six percent of those returning questionnaires about a new recreation facility indicated that they would be in
